BUTLER, A. WEBSTER, 11th Plymouth, Republican, Brockton, born Avon, Aug. 22, 1858; public schools French's Commercial College 1878. Shoe cutter; carriage manufacturer; farmer (took gold medal at San Francisco Exposition, 1916 for largest yield of corn per acre in New England). Common Council 1893-94; Aldermen 1895; Board of Trade, Paul Revere lodge Masons; Damocles lodge Knights of Pythias; honorary member Veteran Fireman's Union. House 1896, 1900-01, committees on libraries, manufactures, public service. Author of amendment, and advocated same on the floor, for conserving natural resources, especially as to drainage of wet lands. Convention adopted same. Committee on Public Service.

BUTTRICK, HON. ALLAN G., 10th Worcester, Republican, Lancaster, born in Fitchburg, March 6, 1876; Boston University Law School 1897. Lawyer. Trinity lodge Masons, Trinity commandery Knights Templar, Aleppo temple Mystic Shrine; 32d degree; Clinton lodge Odd Fellows, Clan Forbes Order of Scottish Clans, Clinton lodge Knights of Pythias, Clinton lodge Elks, Board of Health, Board of Selectmen; School committee (chairman) 1904-6, House 1904, committee on street railways; Senate 1906-7, labor (chairman), legal affairs (chairman), parishes and religious societies, street railways, liquor law, insurance, (chairman), towns, observance of Lord's Day (recess, chairman). CARR, EDWARD, 8th Middlesex, Independent, Hopkinton, born in Dublin, Ire., Dec. 16, 1868; public schools. Lawyer. Masons, Odd Fellows, Foresters of America, Grange. House 1914, 1917, committees on bills in 3d reading, legal affairs, taxation. Committee on Social Insurance.

CHANDLER, HON. LEONARD B., 23d Middlesex, Republican, Somerville, born in Princeton Aug. 29, 1851; public schools. In milk business 1871-1913; real estate owner and manager. Common Council 1893-4; Aldermen 1895-6. John Abbott lodge Masons, Coeur de Lion commandery Knights Templar; Paul Revere lodge Odd Fellows (past grand), Somerville lodge Elks. House 1897-8-9, committees on agriculture, public charitable institutions, taxation; Senate 1902-3, agriculture, counties (chairman), metropolitan affairs, parishes and religious societies (chairman), public charitable institutions (chairman), supply and distribution of coal (special). Mayor 1904-05. Committee on Bill of Rights.

CHARBONNEAU, HENRY V., 15th Middlesex, Republican, Lowell, born there Feb. 3, 1884; public schools, St. Joseph College, Boston Y.M.C.A. Law School, Harvard University. Lawyer. Committee on Labor.

CHASE, MIAL W., 12th Essex, Republican, Lynn, born there Aug. 27, 1867; its public schools, Classical High School 1886; post graduate course at Ludlow (Vt.) Academy. With father and brothers in ice business,—Z. J. Chase & Sons,—until formation of North Shore Ice Delivery Company in 1913—since when he has been its treasurer.
